

The gift of holy spirit

‘Christ in you, the hope of the glory’

The resurrected Christ

- The essence of the resurrected Christ is the spirit of holiness
 - Romans 1:4:
 - ⁴the (*son*) having been marked-out-definitely (*as being*) God's son in ability according to (*the*) spirit of holiness out-from (*the*) resurrection of dead-people – Jesus Christ our Lord,
 - I Peter 3:18:
 - ¹⁸because also Christ once suffered concerning sins, a righteous-person on behalf of unrighteous-people, in order that he may lead you towards God having been put-to-death indeed in flesh but having been made-alive in spirit,

After the Resurrection

- After his resurrection and before his ascension into heaven, the Lord Jesus Christ told his apostles about giving the gift of holy spirit
 - Acts 1:4, 5 and 8:
 - ⁴and being gathered-together with (*them*) he charged to them not to separate-themselves away-from Jerusalem but to wait-concerning "the promise of the Father which you heard of me, ⁵that John indeed baptized with water but you will be baptized in holy spirit after not many (*of*) these days,"
 - ⁸but you will receive ability - the holy spirit having come on you - and you will be my witnesses in both Jerusalem and all Judea and Samaria and until (*the*) last-part of the earth."

Gift of holy spirit given at Pentecost

- Ten days after the ascension was the day of Pentecost in the year 28 A.D.
 - Acts 2:1-4:
 - ^{2:1}And in the fulfillment (*of*) the day of Pentecost they were all together on the same-place, ^{·2}and there became suddenly out-from heaven a sound wholly-as (*the*) carrying of a violent blowing and it filled the whole house where they were sitting-down, ^{·3}and tongues being thoroughly-distributed were seen by them as-though of fire and it sat-down on each one of them, ^{·4}and they were all filled of holy spirit, and they began to utter-forth with different tongues according as the spirit gave to them (*the words*) to precisely-speak-out.

Who gives the gift of holy spirit?

- God gives the gift of holy spirit to mankind by means of the Lord Jesus Christ
 - Acts 2:32 and 33:
 - .³²this Jesus God resurrected of whom we all are witnesses, .³³therefore having been heightened to the right-side of God and having received the promise of the spirit, the holy (*spirit*), from the Father, he poured-out this which you observe and hear,
 - I Thessalonians 4:7 and 8:
 - .⁷for God did not call us on uncleanness but in holiness, .⁸for- therefore the (*person*) rejecting does not reject man but God, the (*One*) giving His spirit, the holy (*spirit*), into you.
 - I John 3:24:
 - .²⁴And the (*person*) keeping His commandments remains in Him and He in him, and in this we know that He remains in us – out- from the spirit which He gave to us.

Who gives the gift of holy spirit? (continued)

- God gives the deposit which is the gift of holy spirit
 - II Corinthians 1:21 and 22:
 - ^{.21}but the *(One)* making us firm together with you into Christ and having anointed us *(is)* God, ^{.22}the *(One)* also having sealed us – even having given the deposit of the spirit in our hearts.
 - II Corinthians 5:5:
 - ^{.5}but the *(One)* having rendered-to-work us into this same-thing *(is)* God, the *(One)* having given to us the deposit of the spirit.
 - Ephesians 1:13 and 14:
 - ^{.13}in whom also you – having heard the word of the truth, the good-message of your salvation, in which also having believed – were sealed with the spirit of the promise, the holy *(spirit)* ^{.14}which is *(the)* deposit of our inheritance into full-redemption of the acquisition into praise of His glory.

Who receives the gift of holy spirit?

- Peter explains to people of the Judean/Israeli background who can receive the gift of holy spirit
 - Acts 2:37-39:
 - ^{.37}... "What may we do, adult-males, brothers?" ^{.38}And Peter (*said*) towards them, "You must repent and each of you must be baptized on the name of Jesus Christ into (*the*) dismissal of your sins and you will receive the free-gift of the holy spirit, ^{.39}for the promise is to you and to your children and to all the (*people*) into distant-places as-many-as ever (*the*) Lord our God may call-towards-Himself,"

Who receives the gift of holy spirit? (continued)

- People who have a Gentile background can also become saved to God and receive the gift of holy spirit
 - Acts 10:44-46:
 - ^{.44}Yet (*during*) Peter's uttering-forth these spoken-matters, the spirit, the holy (*spirit*), fell on all the (*people*) hearing the word; ^{.45}and the believers out-from circumcision, as-many-as went-together with Peter, were bewildered because the free-gift of the holy spirit was poured-out² also on the Gentiles, ^{.46}for they heard them uttering-forth with tongues and expressing-the-greatness-of God;
 - Acts 11:15-17:
 - ^{.15}and in my beginning to utter-forth the spirit, the holy (*spirit*), fell on them wholly-as also on us in (*the*) beginning, ^{.16}and I was caused-to-remember the spoken-matter of the Lord as-that he said, 'John indeed baptized with water but you will be baptized in holy spirit'; ^{.17}therefore since God gave the equal free-gift to them as also to us having believed on the Lord Jesus Christ, was I someone able to hinder God?"

Who receives the gift of holy spirit? (continued)

- Gentiles who believe regarding the Lord Jesus Christ receive the gift of holy spirit
 - Acts 15:7-11:
 - ⁷...Peter, having stood-up, said towards them, "Adult-males, brothers, you well-know that from (*the*) old days among you God selected-for-Himself the Gentiles to hear the word of the good-message by means of my mouth and to believe, ⁸and God, Knower-of-the-heart, bore them witness, having given (*to them*) the spirit, the holy (*spirit*), according as also to us, ⁹and He thoroughly-judged nothing between both us and them having cleaned their hearts with belief.
 - ¹⁰Therefore now, why do you tempt God to put a yoke on the neck of the learning-disciples which neither our fathers nor we were strong to lift-up? – ¹¹but by means of the grace of the Lord Jesus we believe to be saved according to which manner those-people-also."

Who receives the gift of holy spirit? (continued)

- God made the promise of the gift of holy spirit for all of mankind
 - Galatians 3:14:
 - .¹⁴in order that the blessing of Abraham may come-to-pass in Christ Jesus into the nations, in order that we may receive the promise of the spirit by means of the belief.

How to receive holy spirit?

- Paul details how to be saved to God and receive the gift of holy spirit
 - Romans 10:8-10:
 - .⁸...This is the spoken-matter of the belief which we herald-forth .⁹that if-ever you may express-agreement in your mouth (*regarding the*) Lord Jesus Christ and you may believe in your heart that God raised him up out-from dead-people you will be saved; .¹⁰for in (*the*) heart it is believed into righteousness and in (*the*) mouth agreement-is-expressed into salvation.

Saved and receive holy spirit

- Those who become saved receive the gift of holy spirit as the people on the day of Pentecost recorded in Acts chapter 2
 - Acts 8:14-17:
 - ¹⁴But the apostles in Jerusalem having heard that Samaria had accepted² the word of God, they apostled Peter and John towards them, ¹⁵the-people-who having descended prayed concerning them so-that they may receive holy spirit ¹⁶for it was not-yet having fallen² on not-one of them, but they began-to-be only having been baptized² into the name of the Lord Jesus; ¹⁷then they put (*their*) hands on them and they received holy spirit.
 - I Corinthians 6:11:
 - ¹¹Even some (*of you*) used-to-be these-things!; but you washed-yourselves-away-from (*these-things*), but you were made-holy, but you were made-righteous – in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and in the spirit of our God.
 - Titus 3:4-7:
 - ⁴but when the benevolence and the love-for-man of God our Savior was brought-to-light-upon (*us*), ⁵not out-from works, the (*works*) in righteousness which we did, but according to His mercy, He saved us by means of (*the*) washing of re-genesis and (*the*) newing-up of holy spirit ⁶which He poured-out on us wealthily by means of Jesus Christ our savior ⁷in order that having been made-righteous with the grace of that-one we may be caused-to-become inheritors according to hope of eternal life

Saved and receive holy spirit (continued)

- Others became saved and received holy spirit
 - Acts 19:1-7:
 - ^{19:1}But it came-to-pass during Apollos being in Corinth, (*for*) Paul, having gone-through the upper parts, to go-down into Ephesus and to find some learning-disciples, ^{·2}and he said towards them, "If you received holy spirit having believed?" But the (*learning-disciples said*) towards him, "But we have neither heard if some-people receive holy spirit." ^{·3}And he said, "Into what therefore were you baptized?" And the (*learning-disciples*) said, "Into John's baptism."
 - ^{·4}But Paul said, "John baptized (*with the*) baptism of repentance saying to the people (*that his purpose is*) into the (*person*) coming after him in order that they may believe – this is: into Jesus." ^{·5}And having heard, they were baptized into the name of the Lord Jesus, ^{·6}and (*after*) Paul having put (*his*) hands on them, the spirit, the holy (*spirit*), fell on them and they uttered-forth with tongues and they prophesied. ^{·7}And all the adult-males were as-though twelve.

Spirit of Life

- The gift of holy spirit gives life and spiritual thoughts
 - Romans 8:1 and 2:
 - 8:1Consequently now (*there is*) not-one condemning-sentence to the (*people*) in Christ Jesus, ·²for the law of the spirit of the life in Christ Jesus freed you away-from the law of the sin and the death.
 - Romans 8:5-8:
 - ·⁵For the (*people*) being according to flesh think the-things of the flesh, but the (*people*) according to spirit the-things of the spirit, ·⁶for the thinking of the flesh (*is*) death but the thinking of the spirit (*is*) life and peace, ·⁷for-this-reason-that the thinking of the flesh (*is*) enmity into God, for it is not subject to the law of God for neither is it able, ·⁸and the (*people*) being in flesh are not able to please God.

Spirit of Life (continued)

- The gift of holy spirit is within all holy-people
 - Colossians 1:27:
 - 'Christ in you, the hope of the glory'
 - Romans 8:9-11:
 - ⁹But you are not in flesh but in spirit since-indeed (*the*) spirit of God dwells in you; but if someone does not have (*the*) spirit of Christ, this person is not His; ¹⁰but since Christ (*dwells*) in you, the body indeed (*is*) dead because-of sin but the spirit (*is*) life because-of righteousness; ¹¹and since the spirit of the (*One*) having raised-up Jesus out-from dead-people dwells in you, the (*One*) having raised-up Christ out-from dead-people will make-alive also your mortal bodies by means of His spirit indwelling in you.

Spirit of Sonship

- The gift of holy spirit makes us sons of God
 - Romans 8:14 and 15:
 - ¹⁴for as-many-as are led by (*the*) spirit of God these-people are sons of God; ¹⁵for you did not receive a spirit of slavery again into fear, but you received a spirit of sonship – in which we shout, "Abba, Father";
 - Galatians 4:4-7:
 - ⁴but when the fullness of the time came God apostled-out His son, having come-into-being from a woman, having come-into-being under law ⁵in order that he may redeem the (*people*) under law, in order that we may receive the sonship; ⁶but (*since it is true*) that you are sons (*it is true that*) God apostled-out His spirit into our hearts shouting, "Abba, Father" – ⁷so-that you are no-longer a slave but a son, but since (*you are*) a son (*you are*) also an inheritor by means of God.

Inheritance and Hope

- The gift of holy spirit makes us heirs with hope
 - Romans 8:16, 17, 23 and 24:
 - .¹⁶the Spirit Itself bears-witness-together with our spirit that we are children of God, .¹⁷and since children also inheritors, inheritors indeed of God and inheritors-together with Christ since-indeed we suffer-together with (*him*) in order that we may be glorified-together with (*him*).
 - .²³and not only (*this*), but having the first-fruits-offering of the spirit we also ourselves groan in ourselves eagerly-awaiting the full-redemption of our body .²⁴for we were saved to the hope.
 - Romans 15:13:
 - .¹³but may the God of the hope fill you of all joy and peace in believing with-a-view-for you to exceed in the hope in (*the*) ability of holy spirit.

Hope, Love, Encouragement

- The gift of holy spirit gives hope and love
 - Colossians 1:27:
 - 'Christ in you, the hope of the glory'
 - Galatians 5:5 and 6:
 - ⁵For we with spirit from belief eagerly-await (*the*) hope of righteousness, ⁶for in Christ Jesus neither circumcision is strong (*in*) something nor uncircumcision but belief being caused-to-in-work by means of love¹.
 - II Timothy 1:7:
 - ⁷for God did not give to us a spirit of cowardice but of ability and love¹ and sound-thinking,

Hope, Love, Encouragement (continued)

- The gift of holy spirit helps us with God's love and encouragement
 - Romans 5:5:
 - ⁵and the hope does not bring-down-to-shame because the love¹ of God was poured-out² in our hearts by means of holy spirit, the (*holy spirit*) having been given to us.
 - Romans 15:30-32:
 - ³⁰But I encourage you, by means of our Lord Jesus Christ and by means of the love¹ of the spirit, to contest-together with me in the prayers on my behalf towards God ³¹in order that I may be rescued away-from the (*people*) being un-persuaded in Judea, and my ministry, the (*ministry*) into Jerusalem, may become well-accepted by the holy-people, ³²in order that I may go in joy towards you by means of (*the*) intention of God -

Encouragement and Joy

- The gift of holy spirit gives encouragement and joy
 - Acts 9:31:
 - .³¹Therefore indeed the church, according to the whole of Judea and Galilee and Samaria, had peace, being edified and journeying with the fear of the Lord and with the encouragement of the holy spirit it was multiplied.
 - Romans 14:17:
 - .¹⁷for the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking but (*it is*) righteousness and peace and joy in holy spirit,

The spirit and its manifestation

- The gift of holy spirit and its manifestation of itself cannot be purchased with money
 - Acts 8:18-24:
 - ^{.18}But Simon having seen that by means of the putting-on of the hands of the apostles the spirit, the holy (*spirit*), is given, he offered money to them ^{.19}saying, "You must give also to me this authority in order that on whom if-ever I may put (*my*) hands he may receive holy spirit."
 - ^{.20}But Peter said towards him, "Your silver may be into destruction together with you because you regarded-it-as-customary to acquire the free-gift of God by means of money!; ^{.21}there is not a part nor a lot in this word for you for your heart is not straight before God, ^{.22}therefore you must repent away-from this your badness and you must supplicate the Lord if consequently the mind-purpose of your heart will be dismissed from you, ^{.23}for I see you being into (*the*) gall of bitterness and bonding-together of unrighteousness."
 - ^{.24}But Simon having answered said, "You must supplicate on behalf of me towards the Lord so-that nothing may come on me of-which-things you have said²."

The spirit manifests itself

- Paul teaches about the contributions from the gift of holy spirit
 - I Corinthians 12:7-11:
 - ⁷But the manifestation of the spirit is given to each-person towards the-thing contributing,
 - ⁸for indeed, for which (*contribution*) a word of wisdom is given by means of the spirit, but for another (*contribution*) a word of knowledge according to the same spirit, ⁹but for a different (*contribution*) belief in the same spirit, but for another (*contribution*) gracious-gifts of healings in the spirit, ¹⁰but for another (*contribution*) in-workings of ability, for another (*contribution*) prophecy, for another (*contribution*) through-judgments of spirits, for a different (*contribution*) genera of tongues, but for another (*contribution*) interpretation of tongues –
 - ¹¹but the one and the same spirit in-works all these, diverging to each-person according as it deliberately-determines,

The spirit manifests itself (continued)

- Contributions from the spirit of Christ in us
 - I Corinthians 12:12-14:
 - ^{.12}for fully-as the body is one (*body*) and it has many limbs, but all the limbs of the body, being many, it is one body – thus also (*is*) Christ, ^{.13}for also in one spirit we all were baptized into one body, whether Judeans or Greeks or slaves or freemen, and we were all given one spirit to-drink, ^{.14}for also the body is not one limb but many.
 - II Corinthians 3:17 and 18:
 - ^{.17}but the Lord is the spirit, and where the spirit of (*the*) Lord (*is there is*) freedom, ^{.18}and we, with (*our*) face having been uncovered², reflect-from-ourselves the glory of (*the*) Lord, the (*people*) transforming the same image from glory into glory, fully-as from (*the*) Lord (*who is*) spirit.

Receiving contributions from spirit

- Peter received information from the gift of holy spirit within him
 - Acts 4:8-12:
 - .⁸Then Peter having been filled of holy spirit said towards them, "Rulers of the people and elders, .⁹if we today are being judged-up on *(the)* good-work *(done to)* a weak man *(and)* in whom this-person was saved² –
 - .¹⁰it must be known to you all and to all the people of Israel that in the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene whom you crucified, whom God raised-up out-from dead-people, in this *(Jesus)* this-person has stood-beside² before you sound, .¹¹this *(Jesus)* is 'the stone, the *(stone)* having been despised by you the builders, the *(stone)* having become into *(the)* head of *(the)* corner',
 - .¹²and the salvation is not in not-one other-person for neither is there a different name under heaven, the *(name)* having been given² among men, in which it is necessary *(for)* us to be saved."

Receiving contributions from spirit (continued)

- We can be filled with what the gift of holy spirit contributes to us
 - Acts 4:31:
 - ^{.31}and (*after*) their supplicating, the place in which they were having been gathered-together² was shaken, and they were all-together filled of the holy spirit and they uttered-forth the word of God with boldness.
 - Ephesians 5:18-20:
 - ^{.18}and you must not make-yourselves-drunk with wine in which is unsavedness but you must fill-yourselves in spirit, ^{.19}uttering-forth to yourselves, in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs singing and psalming with your heart to the Lord, ^{.20}being thankful always on behalf of all-things in (*the*) name of our Lord Jesus Christ to God and Father,
 - Colossians 3:16 and 17:
 - ^{.16}The word of Christ must indwell in you wealthily in all wisdom teaching and admonishing yourselves, with psalms, hymns, spiritual songs in the grace singing in your hearts to God, ^{.17}and every thing if-ever you may do in word or in work all-things in (*the*) name of (*the*) Lord Jesus, being thankful to God (*the*) Father by means of him.

Receiving contributions from spirit (continued)

- Other holy-people also received various contributions from the gift of holy spirit
 - Acts 6:5 and 8-10:
 - ⁵And the word pleased before all the multitude and they selected-for-themselves Stephen, an adult-male full of belief and of holy spirit...
 - ⁸And Stephen, full of grace and ability, did great wonders and signs among the people. ⁹But some of the (*people*) out-from the synagogue, the (*synagogue*) being said (*as*) Libertines stood-up, and Cyrenians and Alexandrians and of the (*people*) from Cilicia and Asia, disputing-together with Stephen, ¹⁰and they were not strong to stand-against the wisdom and the spirit by-which he uttered-forth.
 - Acts 7:55 and 56:
 - ⁵⁵But being-from-the-beginning full of holy spirit, having gazed-intently into heaven he saw God's glory and Jesus having stood² out-from (*the*) right-sides of God, ⁵⁶and he said, "Look!, I view-with-attention the heavens having been throughly-opened², and the son of man having stood² out-from (*the*) right-sides of God."
 - Acts 11:22-24:
 - ²²...they apostled-out Barnabas until Antioch ²³who, having arrived and having seen the grace of God, joyed and encouraged all-people with purpose of heart to remain with the Lord; ²⁴because he was a good adult-male and full of holy spirit and belief, and a sufficient crowd was added to the Lord.

Receiving contributions from spirit (continued)

- Other records

- Acts 19:21:

- .²¹But as these-things were fulfilled, Paul put in the spirit (*that*) having gone-through Macedonia and Achaia to journey into Jerusalem, having said that, "After I become there, it is necessary (*for*) me also to see Rome."

- Acts 20:22:

- .²²And now look!, having been bound² I with the spirit journey into Jerusalem, not having known² the-things (*which*) will be meeting me in it,

- Acts 23:11:

- .¹¹But on the coming night the Lord having stood-on him said, "You must be courageous, for as you thoroughly-witnessed the-things concerning me into Jerusalem thus it is necessary (*for*) you to witness also into Rome."

Receiving contributions from spirit (continued)

- The contribution of prophecy
 - Acts 11:27 and 28:
 - .²⁷But in these days prophets came-down from Jerusalem into Antioch, .²⁸and having stood-up one-person out-from them, Agabus by-name, signified by means of the spirit (*that there was about*) to be a great famine on the whole inhabited-area - the-one-which came-to-pass on Claudius –
 - Acts 21:10 and 11:
 - .¹⁰But remaining-on more days some prophet, Agabus by-name, came-down from Judea, .¹¹and having come towards us and having lifted Paul's girdle, having bound the feet and the hands of himself, he said, "The Spirit, the Holy (*Spirit*), says the-things-here: 'The adult-male whose this girdle is, thus the Judeans will bind in Jerusalem and they will give-over into Gentiles' hands.' "
 - I Corinthians 14:3:
 - .³but the (*person*) prophesying utters-forth to men edification and encouragement and comfort;

Receiving contributions from spirit (continued)

- The gift of holy spirit enables us to recognize spiritual things
 - Acts 13:9-12:
 - ⁹But Saul, also (*called*) Paul, having been filled of holy spirit, having gazed-intently into him, ¹⁰said, "Oh full of all deceit and all recklessness, son of (*the*) devil, enemy of all righteousness, you will not stop thoroughly-turning the ways of (*the*) Lord, the straight (*ways*); ¹¹and now look!, (*the*) hand of (*the*) Lord (*is*) on you and you will be blind not observing the sun continuously-until a time." And with-that a mist and darkness fell on him, and leading-around he sought-after hand-leaders.
 - ¹²Then the proconsul, having seen the-thing having come-to-pass², believed being shocked on the teaching of the Lord.

Receiving contributions from spirit (continued)

- We can be aware of our surroundings
 - Ephesians 2:2:
 - ²in which at-some-time you walked according to the age of this world, according to the ruler of the authority of the air, of the spirit, the (*spirit*) now in-working in the sons of the un-persuasion,
 - Ephesians 6:12:
 - ^{.12}but because the wrestling is not for you against blood and flesh but against the rulerships, against the authorities, against the world-strong-ones of this darkness, against the spiritual-things of the evilness in the heavenlies;
 - Galatians 4:29:
 - ^{.29}but wholly-as then the (*son*) having been born according to flesh used-to-persecute the (*son having been born*) according to Spirit, thus also now;

Receiving contributions from spirit (continued)

- We can be alert regarding the spirit category
 - II Thessalonians 2:2:
 - ²for you not to be quickly shaken away-from the mind-set nor to be caused-tumult neither by means of spirit, nor by means of word, nor by means of letter as (*if it were*) by means of us - as that the day of the Lord stood-in²;
 - I Timothy 4:1:
 - ^{4:1}But the spirit speaking says that in times afterwards some-people will depart-from the belief having-attention to wandering spirits and teachings of devils,

Receiving contributions from spirit (continued)

- We can know from which spirit realm the information originates
 - I John 4:1-6:
 - ^{4:1}Loved-people¹, you must not believe every spirit, but you must prove the spirits if they are out-from God because many lying-prophets went-out² into the world. ²In this you know the spirit of God – every spirit which expresses-agreement (*regarding*) Jesus Christ having come² in flesh is out-from God, ³and every spirit which does not express-agreement (*regarding*) Jesus is not out-from God and this is the (*spirit*) of antichrist which you heard² that it comes and now is already in the world. ⁴You are out-from God, little-children, and you were-victorious-over² them because the (*one*) in you is greater than the (*one*) in the world. ⁵They are out-from the world because-of-this – they utter-forth out-from the world and the world hears them. ⁶We are out-from God; the (*person*) knowing God hears us; he-who does not hear us is not out-from God – out-from this we know the spirit of the truth and the spirit of the wandering.

Receiving contributions from spirit (continued)

- The gift of holy spirit reveals information
 - I Corinthians 2:9 and 10:
 - ⁹...according as it was written², "Which-things eye did not see and ear did not hear, and it did not ascend on (*the*) heart of man which-things God prepared for the (*people*) loving¹ Him," ¹⁰for God revealed (*them*) to us by means of the spirit, for the spirit searches all-things, even the deep-things of God.
 - Ephesians 3:4 and 5:
 - ⁴...the mystery of the Christ, ⁵which (*during*) different generations was not made-known to the sons of men as now it was revealed to His holy apostles and prophets in spirit,

Receiving contributions from spirit (continued)

- The gift of holy spirit makes known information from God
 - I Corinthians 2:11-13:
 - ^{.11}For who of men knew² the-things of the man except the spirit of the man, the (*spirit*) in him, thus also the-things of God not-one (*person or spirit*) knew² except the Spirit of God; ^{.12}and we did not receive the spirit of the world but the spirit, the (*spirit*) out-from God, in order that we may have known² the-things having been graced to us by God, ^{.13}which-things also we utter-forth, not in taught words of manly wisdom but in taught-things of spirit - judging-together spiritual-things with spiritual;

Receiving contributions from spirit (continued)

- Holy-people have the mind of Christ in the spirit category
 - I Corinthians 2:14-16:
 - ^{.14}but a soulish man does not accept the-things of the Spirit of God for they are dullness to him and he is not able to know (*them*) because they are spiritually judged-up, ^{.15}but the spiritual-person judges-up all-things - but he is judged-up by not-one (*person or spirit*), ^{.16}for "Who knew (*the*) mind of (*the*) Lord, he-who will compact it together with (*his mind*)?" - but we have (*the*) mind of Christ.

Fruit from the spirit

- We can take the fruit that the gift of holy spirit produces
 - Galatians 5:22 and 23:
 - .²²But the fruit of the spirit is: love¹, joy, peace, patience, benevolence, goodness, belief, .²³meekness, self-control – against the things-of-this-kind there is not law,

The spirit intercedes

- The gift of holy spirit intercedes on our behalf
 - Romans 8:26-28:
 - .²⁶But likewise also the spirit helps-together with our weakness, for we did not know² what-thing we may pray according to that-which is necessary, but the spirit itself intercedes-on-behalf-of (*us*) with unutterable groanings, .²⁷and the (*One*) searching the hearts knew² what the thinking of the spirit (*is*) because it intercedes according to God on behalf of holy-people, .²⁸and we knew² that with the (*people*) loving¹ God, God works-together everything into good, with the (*people*) being called according to purpose –

Pray in spirit

- We can pray in spirit
 - Ephesians 6:17 and 18:
 - .¹⁷and you must accept the helmet of the salvation and the sword of the spirit, which is (*the*) spoken-matter of God, .¹⁸by means of all prayer and supplication praying in every time in spirit; and with-a-view-to (*this*) same-thing being sleepless in all strongness-towards and supplication concerning all the holy-people,
 - Jude 1:20 and 21:
 - .²⁰But you, loved-people¹, building yourselves on your holiest belief, praying in holy spirit, .²¹must keep yourselves in (*the*) love¹ of God waiting-for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ into eternal life;
 - Philippians 1:19:
 - .¹⁹but I knew² that this will go-away to me into salvation by means of your supplication and full-supply of the spirit of Christ Jesus,

Serve God in spirit

- We can serve God within the sphere of action of the gift of holy spirit
 - Romans 1:9-12:
 - ⁹for God is witness of me, to Whom I render-service in my spirit in the good-message of His son, as-that unceasingly I make remembrance to-myself of you ¹⁰always on my prayers supplicating if by-some-manner at-some-time I will be prospered already in the intention of God to go towards you, ¹¹for I earnestly-long to see you in order that I may sharingly-give to you some spiritual gracious-gift with-a-view-for you to be set-fast, ¹²and this is: to be encouraged-together among you by means of the belief among one-another both yours and mine.
 - Romans 7:6:
 - ⁶but now we have been rendered-ineffective away-from the law having died in that-which we used-to be-held-down, so-that we serve-as-slaves in newness of spirit and not (*in*) oldness of writing.
 - Romans 12:11:
 - ¹¹not slothful with earnest-diligence, boiling with spirit, serving-as-slaves to the Lord,

Serve God in spirit (continued)

- We can worship God and render service in spirit
 - John 4:24:
 - .²⁴God *(is)* Spirit, and it is necessary *(for)* the *(people)* worshipping Him to worship in spirit and truth."
 - Philippians 3:3:
 - .³for we are the circumcision, the *(people)* rendering-service with spirit and boasting in Christ Jesus and not having been persuaded² in flesh.

The ability of the spirit

- We can receive ability from the gift of holy spirit
 - Romans 15:18 and 19:
 - ¹⁸for I will not dare to utter-forth something of which-things Christ did not render-to-work by means of me, with-a-view-to obedience of Gentiles, by word and by work ¹⁹in his ability, both of signs and wonders in *(the)* ability of *(the)* spirit of God, so-as-for me to have filled² from Jerusalem and circling-round up-until Illyricum *(with)* the good-message of Christ.
 - I Thessalonians 1:5 and 6:
 - ⁵because our good-message was not caused-to-become into you in word only but also in ability and in holy spirit and much full-assurance according as you knew² the-kind-of-people we were caused-to-become with you because-of you, ⁶and you were caused-to-become imitators of us and of the Lord, having accepted the word, in much pressure, with joy of holy spirit

The ability of the spirit (continued)

- The gift of holy spirit gives us God's ability
 - I Corinthians 2:4 and 5:
 - ⁴and my word and my heralded-proclamation (*were*) not in persuasions of wisdom but in pointing-out of spirit and of ability ⁵in order that your belief may not be in men's wisdom but in God's ability.
 - Ephesians 3:16:
 - ¹⁶in order that He may give to you according to the wealth of His glory: to be caused-to-be-strong with ability by means of His Spirit into the inside man,

Behave according to the spirit

- Holy-people can behave according to the gift of holy spirit
 - I Corinthians 3:1-4:
 - ^{3:1}And I, brothers, was not caused-to-be-able to utter-forth to you as to spiritual-people but as to fleshy-people, as to infants in Christ, ^{·2}I gave you milk to-drink, not food, for you used-to not-yet be-able, but neither are you now able ^{·3}for you are yet fleshly, for where (*there are*) among you jealousy and strife and dissensions aren't you fleshy and walk according to man? - (*yes*) - ^{·4}for whenever someone may say, "I indeed am of Paul" and a different-person "I of Apollos," you are as-men, aren't you? - (*yes.*)

Behave according to the spirit (continued)

- We can walk in line with the gift of holy spirit
 - II Corinthians 7:1:
 - ^{7:1}Therefore having these promises, loved-people¹, let us clean ourselves from all soiling of flesh, and with spirit fully-completing holiness in *(the)* love¹ of God.
 - Galatians 5:16-18:
 - ^{.16}But I say: you must walk by spirit, and let you never complete *(the)* intense-yearning of flesh, ^{.17}for the flesh intensely-years against the spirit but the spirit *(is)* against the flesh, for these-things are adverse to one-another in order that you may not do these-things which if-ever you may intend; ^{.18}but since you are led by spirit you are not under law.
 - Galatians 5:25:
 - ^{.25}since we live with spirit, let us walk-in-line-with spirit,

Behave according to the spirit (continued)

- We can do things with a view to the spirit category
 - Galatians 6:7 and 8:
 - ⁷You must not be caused-to-wander, God is not mocked, for that-which if-ever a man may sow this he will also harvest ⁸because the (*person*) sowing into the flesh of himself out-from the flesh he will harvest corruption but the (*person*) sowing into the spirit out-from the spirit he will harvest eternal life.
 - I Thessalonians 5:19 and 20:
 - ¹⁹the spirit you must not quench; ²⁰prophecies you must not despise;

Behave according to the spirit (continued)

- The new man and the spirit of your mind
 - Ephesians 4:22-24:
 - ^{.22}you (*are*) to put-away-from-yourselfes according to the former behavior, the old man, the (*old man*) being corrupted according to the intense-yearnings of the deceit, ^{.23}but you must new-yourselfes-up with the spirit of your mind ^{.24}and you must clothe-yourselfes-with the new man, the (*new man*) according to God having been created in righteousness and holiness of the truth;
 - Ephesians 4:30:
 - ^{.30}and you must not cause the spirit sorrow, the holy (*spirit*) of God in which you were sealed into (*the*) day of full-redemption;

Spirit living in holy-people

- The gift of holy spirit is living inside of all holy-people
 - I Corinthians 3:16 and 17:
 - ^{.16}You knew² that you are (*the*) interior-temple of God, even the spirit of God dwells in you, don't you? – (*yes*) – ^{.17}if someone corrupts the interior-temple of God, God will corrupt this (*person or spirit*), for the interior-temple of God is holy, the-people-whom you are.
 - I Corinthians 6:17- 20:
 - ¹⁷but the (*person*) being-glued-together to the Lord is one spirit!
^{.18}You must flee fornication; every sin which if-ever a man may do is outside-of the body, but the (*person*) fornicating sins into (*his*) own body. ^{.19}Or, you knew² that your body is (*the*) interior-temple of the holy spirit in you which you have from God, and you are not of yourselves, don't you? – (*yes*) – ^{.20}for you were bought of price; indeed you must glorify God in your body.

Spirit living in holy-people (continued)

- God dwells in us via the gift of holy spirit
 - Ephesians 2:19-22:
 - ^{.19}...you are citizens-together with the holy-people, even God's household-people, ^{.20}having been built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets – Christ Jesus himself being *(the)* extreme-corner, ^{.21}in whom all *(the)* building joining-together increases into *(the)* holy interior-temple in *(the)* Lord, ^{.22}in whom also you are being built-together into *(the)* dwelling-down-place of God in spirit.

One gift of holy spirit

- The one gift of holy spirit gives access to God our Father
 - Ephesians 2:18:
 - ^{.18}because by means of him we both have the access in one spirit towards the Father.
 - Ephesians 4:3-6:
 - ^{.3}being earnestly-diligent to keep the oneness of the spirit in the bonding-together of the peace: ^{.4}(*for there is*) one body and one spirit, according as also you were called in one hope of your calling, ^{.5}one Lord, one belief, one baptism, ^{.6}one God and Father of all (*holy-people*), the (*One being*) upon all and through all and in all;
 - I Corinthians 12:4:
 - ^{.4}But there are divergences of gracious-gifts, but the same spirit;
 - I Corinthians 12:12-14:
 - ^{.12}for fully-as the body is one (*body*) and it has many limbs, but all the limbs of the body, being many, it is one body – thus also (*is*) Christ, ^{.13}for also in one spirit we all were baptized into one body, whether Judeans or Greeks or slaves or freemen, and we were all given one spirit to-drink, ^{.14}for also the body is not one limb but many.

One gift of holy spirit (continued)

- There is a difference between spirit-life and soul-life
 - Philippians 1:27:
 - ^{.27}only, you must live-being-citizens worthily of the good-message of Christ in order that whether having come and having seen you or being absent I hear the-things concerning you that you stand-firm in one spirit, one soul, contending-together with the belief of the good-message,
 - I Thessalonians 5:23:
 - ^{.23}But may the God of the peace Himself make wholly-completive you holy, and may your whole-lot - the spirit and the soul and the body - be blamelessly kept in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ.
 - Hebrews 4:12:
 - ^{.12}for the word of God (*is*) living, and in-working, and more-cutting over every two-edged sword, and reaching-through continuously-until (*the*) distribution of soul and of spirit, both of joints and of marrows, and apt-to-judge (*the*) thinkings-within and mind-purposes-within of (*the*) heart,
 - Acts 7:59 and 60:
 - ^{.59}and they threw-stones-at Stephen calling-upon (*the Lord Jesus*) to-himself and saying, "Lord Jesus, you must accept my spirit," ^{.60}and having knelt-down he shouted with a great sound, "Lord, may you not cause this sin to stand to them," and having said this he was caused-to-sleep.

Spiritual Blessing

- Holy-people have been blessed with every spiritual blessing
 - Ephesians 1:3 and 4:
 - ³Blessed (*is*) the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the (*One*) having blessed us in every spiritual blessing in the heavenlies in Christ ⁴according as He selected us for-Himself in him before (*the*) throwing-down of (*the*) world (*for*) us to be holy and without-blemish down-before Him in love¹,

Examples

- The manifestation (evidence) of the holy spirit-life within each holy-person is given by God or by the Lord Jesus Christ to each holy-person towards that-which is spiritually contributing (refer to I Corinthians 12:7-10).
- There are many records in the Book of Acts, but not all of them specify which contributions were given to a holy-person during a specific situation or circumstance – however, we can read about their effects on various people, spirits, situations, etc.

Examples

- Some examples of these 9 contributions in evidence are:
 - Acts 3:1-3 – But Peter and John ascended into the temple on the hour of prayer, the ninth (*hour*), and some adult-male being-from-the-beginning lame from his mother's womb was lifted-up whom they put daily towards the door of the temple, the (*door*) being said (*as*) Beautiful, to ask a merciful-deed from the (*people*) journeying into the temple, who, having seen Peter and John being about to enter into the temple, asked to receive a merciful-deed.
 - Acts 3:4 – Peter having gazed-intently into him, together with John, said, "You must observe into us,"
 - [word of wisdom – received and acted upon by Peter and John;
 - word of knowledge – received and spoken by Peter]

Examples

- Acts 3:5 and 6 – and the (*man*) held-on to them expecting to receive something from them, and Peter said, "Silver and gold does not begin-from me, but that-which I have this-thing I give to you - in the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene you must walk,"
 - [belief – received by Peter;
 - gracious-gifts of healings – received by Peter;
 - belief – spoken by Peter,
 - thereby making the belief and the gracious-gifts of healings available to take effect on the man]

Examples

- Acts 3:7 – and having apprehended him with the right hand he raised him up and with-that his steppings and anklebones were made-solid,
 - [word of wisdom – received and acted upon by Peter]
- Acts 3:8 – and (*he*) leaping-out stood and he walked and went together with them into the temple walking and leaping and speaking-in-praise-of God.
 - [the man received the effects of the word of wisdom, word of knowledge, belief, and the gracious-gifts of healings]

Examples

- Acts 16:16-18a – But it came-to-pass (*during*) our journeying into the prayer (*for*) some servant-girl having a spirit of python to meet us, she-who presented much work to her lords (*by*) soothsaying. She, closely-following Paul and us, shouted saying, "These men are slaves of God the Highest, the-people-who message to you a way of salvation"; and she did this-thing on many days.
- Acts 16:18b – But Paul having been throughly-pained and having turned-back to the spirit said, "I charge to you in (*the*) name of Jesus Christ to go-out away-from her";
 - [belief – received by Paul;
 - through-judgments of spirits – received by Paul;
 - belief – spoken by Paul
 - thereby making the belief and the through-judgments of spirits available to take effect on the evil spirit]
- Acts 16:18c – and it went-out the same hour.
 - [the evil spirit received the effects of the belief and the through-judgments of spirits]

Examples

- Acts 19:6 – ...the spirit, the holy (*spirit*), fell on them and they uttered-forth with tongues and they prophesied.
 - [genera of tongues – received and spoken by these holy-people;
 - belief – received by these holy-people;
 - prophecy – received and spoken (prophesied) by these holy-people,
 - these holy-people and all others present received the effects of the genera of tongues, belief, and the prophecy]

Examples

- Acts 19:11 and 12 – and God did abilities, not the (*abilities*) having been (*ordinarily*) attained, by means of the hands of Paul so-as-for even handkerchiefs or aprons to be carried away-from the surface-of-his-body onto the (*people*) being weak, and the diseases to be removed-from them, and the spirits, the evil (*spirits*), to be caused to journey-out-from (*the people*).
 - [belief – received by Paul;
 - in-workings of ability – received by Paul;
 - belief and in-workings of ability – acted upon by Paul;
 - the people and evil spirits received the effects of the belief and the in-workings of ability]

Examples

- I Corinthians 14:2-5:
 - the (*person*) uttering-forth with a tongue does not utter-forth to men but to God, for not-one-person hears (*with understanding*) but he utters-forth mysteries with spirit,
 - but the (*person*) prophesying utters-forth to men edification and encouragement and comfort;
 - the (*person*) uttering-forth with a tongue edifies himself,
 - but the (*person*) prophesying edifies (*the*) church.
 - But I intend all of you to utter-forth with tongues,
 - but rather in order that you may prophesy;
 - but the (*person*) prophesying (*is*) greater than the (*person*) uttering-forth with tongues outside-of except he may throughly-interpret in order that the church may receive edification.
- I Corinthians 14:27 – whether someone utters-forth with a tongue according to two or the most three, and (*each*) by-(*his*)-part, and (*each*) one must throughly-interpret.
 - [genera of tongues – received and spoken by the holy-person;
 - interpretation of tongues – received and spoken by the same holy-person;
 - the people present receive the effects of the genera of tongues and the interpretation of those tongues]

Examples

- Asking for help during a specific situation or circumstance
 - Acts 4:24 and 29-31:
 - .²⁴and the (*apostles*) having heard like-mindedly lifted (*their*) sound towards God and said,
 - ...
 - .²⁹and the-things now, Lord, You must look on their threats and You must give to Your slaves (*the ability*) to utter-forth Your Word with all boldness .³⁰in Your stretching-out Your hand into healing and signs and wonders to come-to-pass by means of the name of Your holy child Jesus";
 - .³¹and (*after*) their supplicating, the place in which they were having been gathered-together² was shaken, and they were all-together filled of the holy spirit and they uttered-forth the word of God with boldness.
 - God granted their specific prayerful request.

Examples

- Picking fruit which is already available from the gift of holy spirit
 - Romans 5:5:
 - .⁵and the hope does not bring-down-to-shame because the love¹ of God was poured-out² in our hearts by means of holy spirit, the (*holy spirit*) having been given to us.
 - Philippians 1:9-11:
 - .⁹and this I pray: in order that your love¹ may yet rather and rather exceed in full-knowledge and all perception .¹⁰with-a-view-for you to prove the-things differing in order that you may be genuine and un-stumbling into the day of Christ, .¹¹having been filled² (*with the*) fruit of righteousness, the (*fruit*) by means of Jesus Christ into (*the*) glory and praise of God.

Examples

- Romans 14:16-18:
 - .¹⁶Therefore your good-thing must not be blasphemed, .¹⁷for the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking but (*it is*) righteousness and peace and joy in holy spirit, .¹⁸for the (*person*) serving-as-a-slave to Christ in this (*is*) well-pleasing to God and approved to men.
- Acts 9:31:
 - .³¹Therefore indeed the church, according to the whole of Judea and Galilee and Samaria, had peace, being edified and journeying with the fear of the Lord and with the encouragement of the holy spirit it was multiplied.

Examples

- Ephesians 4:1-6:
 - 4:1 Therefore I encourage you, I, the prisoner in *(the)* Lord, to walk worthily of the calling of-which you were called, ·2 with all humbleness-of-mind and meekness, with patience, holding-yourselves-up-with one-another in love¹, ·3 being earnestly-diligent to keep the oneness of the spirit in the bonding-together of the peace: ·4 *(for there is)* one body and one spirit, according as also you were called in one hope of your calling, ·5 one Lord, one belief, one baptism, ·6 one God and Father of all *(holy-people)*, the *(One being)* upon all and through all and in all;

Examples

- Colossians 3:10-13:
 - ^{.10}and having clothed-yourselves-with the new (*man*), the (*new man*) being newed-up into full-knowledge according to (*the*) image of the (*One*) having created him ^{.11}where there is not in (*him*) a Greek and a Judean, circumcision and uncircumcision, barbarian, Scythian, slave, freeman – but Christ (*is*) all-things and in all-people; ^{.12}therefore you must clothe-yourselves-with – as selected-people of God, holy-people, also having been loved^{1,2} – inner-parts of pity, benevolence, humbleness-of-mind, meekness, patience, ^{.13}holding-yourselves-up-with one-another and graciously-forgiving yourselves if-ever someone may have a cause-for-blame towards someone, according as also the Lord graciously-forgave you thus also you (*must graciously-forgive*),

Examples

- Romans 15:13 and 14:
 - .¹³but may the God of the hope fill you of all joy and peace in believing with-a-view-for you to exceed in the hope in (*the*) ability of holy spirit. .¹⁴But I was persuaded², brothers, even I myself concerning you, that you are full of goodness, having been filled² of all knowledge, being able also to admonish one-another;
- Ephesians 5:8-10:
 - .⁸for you used-to-be at-some-time dark but now (*you are*) light in (*the*) Lord, as children of light you must walk – .⁹for the fruit of the light (*is*) in all goodness and righteousness and truth – .¹⁰proving what is well-pleasing to the Lord,

Examples

- Jude 1:20 and 21:
 - .²⁰But you, loved-people¹, building yourselves on your holiest belief, praying in holy spirit, .²¹must keep yourselves in (*the*) love¹ of God waiting-for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ into eternal life;
- I Corinthians 4:18-21:
 - .¹⁸But as-to my not coming towards you, some-people were puffed-up, .¹⁹but I will come quickly towards you if-ever the Lord may intend, and I will know not the word of the (*people*) having been puffed-up² but the ability, .²⁰for the kingdom of God (*is*) not in word but in ability. .²¹What do you intend – (*that*) I may come in a rod towards you or in love¹ and spirit of meekness?

Examples

- Galatians 6:1:
 - ^{6:1}Brothers, also if-ever a man may be taken-beforehand in some falling-aside, you, the spiritual-people, must fully-equip the person-of-this-kind in (*the*) spirit of meekness – scoping yourself (*that*) also you may not be tempted!
- II Peter 1:5-7:
 - ^{.5}but this same-thing also: having carried-in-beside all earnest-diligence you must fully-supply in your belief the virtue, but in the virtue the knowledge, ^{.6}but in the knowledge the self-control, but in the self-control the patient-endurance, but in the patient-endurance the reverence, ^{.7}but in the reverence the brotherly-love, but in the brotherly-love the love¹;

Examples

- We have a reason to get up in the morning and live our lives to the fullest according to God's will
 - Philippians 3:13-16:
 - .¹³Brothers, I do not calculate myself to have taken-hold², but one-thing: indeed forgetting the-things behind but stretching-out-on the-things in-front, .¹⁴I pursue according to (*the*) target into the prize of the upward calling of God. .¹⁵Therefore as-many-as (*are*) complete-people let us think this, and if you think something differently God will reveal this also to you, .¹⁶besides, into that-which we have come-ahead-of (*we are*) to walk-in-line-with the same-thing.

Examples

- Romans 12:1 and 2:
 - ^{12:1}Therefore I encourage you, brothers, by means of the mercies of God, to present your bodies (*as*) a living sacrifice, holy, well-pleasing to God (*which is*) your logical rendering-of-service, ^{·2}and you must not outwardly-figure-yourself-together with this age but you must transform-yourself by the renewing-up of the mind with-a-view-for you to prove what the intention of God (*is*) – the good and well-pleasing and complete (*intention of God*).

Examples

- Romans 12:3-5:
 - ³For I say by means of the grace, the (*grace*) having been given to me, to every-person being among you, not to super-think against that-which it is necessary to think but to think with-a-view to soundly-think as God distributed a measure of belief to each-person;
 - ⁴for fully-as we have many limbs in one body but all the limbs do not have the same practice, ⁵thus we (*being*) many-people are one body in Christ but uniquely limbs of one-another;

Examples

- Romans 12:6-8:
 - ^{·6}but having different gracious-gifts according to the grace, the (*grace*) having been given to us – whether prophecy according to the proportion of the belief, ^{·7}whether ministry in the ministry; whether the (*person*) teaching in the teaching, ^{·8}the (*person*) encouraging in the encouragement, the (*person*) sharingly-giving in singleness, the (*person*) standing-before (*others*) in earnest-diligence, the (*person*) being merciful-towards (*others*) in cheerfulness;
